It is hard to over-estimate the significance of the first four books of the New Testament. Known as the Gospels, they give us the picture of Jesus of Nazareth that has made him as famous a name as any in human history. What shall we make of these four books? What themes and aims do they share? How do their different agendas, perspectives, and editorial policies shape these books and distinguish them from each other? How shall we make sense of the contradictions that appear when we place the gospels alongside each other? And how do the differences enrich the picture of Jesus that they give us?

Whether you have never read the gospels before and have no idea what they say, or read them many times and puzzled over what to make of them, you are welcome in this class. The class will be both accessible to those who are new to these texts and challenging to those who know them well.
